

### **Requirements and Restrictions:**

1. Any karter wishing to be considered as an entrant must submit their application and racing resume via mail, e-mail or fax no later than **August 30, 2011**.
2. Applicants must be actively and currently racing karts in an organized championship. Club racing is acceptable but indoor karting experience is not considered.
3. Applicants must be between 13 and 25 years of age by the event date November 2, 2011.
4. Final accepted-entrants must pay an entry fee of \$2,500 at time of confirmed enrollment.
5. Final accepted-entrants must purchase and complete a Skip Barber Three Day Racing School prior to the Shoot-out.
6. Applicants need to have completed either a Skip Barber Three Day Racing School or a Skip Barber Advanced Activity after December 2010.
7. Applicants can not have participated in any amateur or professional auto racing weekends prior to the Shoot-out.
8. Applicants may have a maximum of 12 Advanced Activity days from the 2010 to 2011 Skip Barber Karting Scholarship Shootout.
9. Previous Shootout award winners are eligible for future karting shootouts if they still meet the other eligibility rules.
10. If after event it is deemed that an award winner was not eligible at the time of winning the award, Skip Barber Racing School reserves the right to revoke the award.

### **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### **1. I've been racing karts for a long time. Why do I need a school?**
